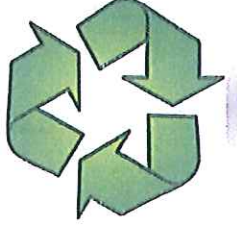

Commingled Recycling

Mix One

These containers can be mixed together:

ASEPTIC CONTAINERS:

Cartons used for juice, milk, ice cream or broths. Caps off and rinsed.

CONTAINER GLASS

Includes container glass only - clear, green, and brown. Glass must be clean, with caps removed. Labels and neck rings can remain. Glass should not be broken. **Does not include** ceramic cups, dishes, ovenware, plate glass, safety and window glass, heat-resistant glass such as Pyrex, lead-based glass such as crystal, or TV tubes.

PLASTIC BOTTLES & CONTAINERS

Includes all plastic bottles and containers clearly marked with the recycling emblem encircling the #1 through #7 of all colors.

Does not include motor oil bottles, chemical containers, ag plastics, or Styrofoam (even if #6)

Caps must be removed, but can be recycled. Labels and neck rings can remain on. Clean all bottles and containers.

TIN & ALUMINUM CANS

Includes tin, bi-metal, and aluminum cans which must be clean with labels removed. Cut out ends are recyclable, too. **No aerosol or paint cans.**

Mix Two

These paper products can be mixed together:

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Includes clean corrugated cardboard only, and **does not include** waxed cardboard. Cardboard must be flattened.

MIXED PAPERS

Includes all grades of papers: including white, colored, ledger, shiny, coated, carbonless or NCR papers; envelopes, including windowed, labeled and kraft; paper bags, catalogs/magazines, phone books, computer printout paper, glued pads and tablets, file folders, post-it notes, spiral notebooks, cereal, shoe, and soda boxes, etc.

Can include paper clips and staples.

Can be placed for collection in paper grocery bags, boxes, or bundled in bundles not more than twelve (12) inches high.

Does not include hand towels or other paper products from restrooms, or soiled napkins and paper plates, and **does not include** carbon paper, cellophane, or any waxed paper.

NEWSPAPERS

Includes newspapers and newspaper advertisements.

Additional Recycling Opportunities

Additional Recycling Opportunities

Most household and farm electronics, appliances, chemicals, and tires may not be placed in landfills. There are other opportunities for disposing of these items:

- **Hazardous waste, electronics, and appliances may be recycled at Clean Sweeps, which will be held in May and August. This is a free/low-cost service.**
- **Old tire collections are held in August. Prices will be announced.**

Film plastics recycling may also be available. Contact your municipality for more information.
